### **1.** The Albanian Authorities have provided the following information:

1.1. The situation is under control. In addition to their fire-fighting efforts, the lower temperatures and the increased precipitation favorable influenced the situation.

1.2. Consequently, Albanian authorities have advised the EADRCC that, due to a return to normality, Albania would no longer require international assistance.

1.3. Albanian authorities have also expressed their thanks to all EAPC nations that provided them with their support and indispensable assistance.

## 2. Assistance offered or provided by EAPC nations, by country:

2.1. The Ukrainian aircraft "Antonov 32" operated from 27 July to 5 August.

2.2. One Slovenian KFOR helicopter operated from 30 July to 3 August.

2.3. **Two** fire fighting **helicopters with Bambi Bucket** from two **German private companies** operated from **31 July to 5 August**.

2.4. Greece offered fire fighting equipment and some fire fighting aerial operations.

2.5. **The Czech Republic** offered fire protection equipment (vide 2.5.1.). The donation arrived to Albania on 1 August.

2.6. Italy offered 2 Canadair, CL 415 for two days. In addition, Italy has permanently deployed

a "Canadair" at Tirana International Airport in order to support any further fire fighting activities.
